Clever Fish opened in 2016 as an After School Programme. Soon parents, whose children were not seeing success in larger, more formal schools, approached Clever Fish about homeschooling. We started as a small homeschool and in 2020 were licensed as a school offering full-time education to children in Years 7-11.

From our humble beginnings, we have established a solid reputation as a caring school that prioritises individual well-being and happiness. Children are measured from their individual starting points and are always reminded that kindness, happiness, and resilience are as important as their academic grades.

In Sept 2025 we will transition from Clever Fish to the new CF School in Buttonwood Park. The new school will accommodate approximately 45 children per year group, around 15 children per class. Our school's name 'CF School' echoes our original name of Clever Fish, adapting it to reflect our ethos in our new name 'Creating Foundations' for children to thrive.

CF School provides a nurturing and supportive high school environment for children in Years 7-11.

We take our lead from the English National Curriculum leading to the two-year Cambridge IGCSE syllabus in Years 10 and 11.

Personal well-being and happiness are valued by us, as much as academic success. We truly believe that happy, healthy children thrive.

We offer a modern school day where children can be dropped off at 7.45am and collected up to 5.30pm.

Small class sizes of around 15 children allows each child to make exceptional progress.


We welcome children with additional learning needs who would thrive in our school.

Our Curriculum

English based curriculum leading to Cambridge IGCSEs at the of Year 11.



At Key Stage 3 (Years 7, 8 and 9) all children study the following subjects, with each subject being taught by a subject specialist: **English, Maths, Science, History, Geography, Religious Studies, Latin, Spanish, Art, Drama, Music, and ICT.**

Three days a week children have a scheduled PE lesson ensuring time is dedicated to outdoor play and physical activity.

At Key Stage 4 (Years 10 and 11) children are prepared for **up to 9** Cambridge IGCSEs (International General Certificate of Secondary Education)

<u>Mandatory IGCSEs</u>: English Language (1) English Literature (1) Maths (1) Coordinated Science: Chemistry, Biology, and Physics (2) and Latin or Spanish (1) = 6 IGCSEs

Option Choices: Spanish or Latin, History, Geography, Religious Studies, Travel & Tourism, Business Studies, ICT, and Marine Science (up to 3 option choices).

Why Latin?

- Studies prove that children who study Latin perform higher in English and Modern Foreign Languages.
- Studying Latin is beneficial for any child looking to attend a UK boarding school.
- Latin is consistently a popular subject amongst children.
- A qualification in Latin can help with a route to better universities.

We have raised aspirations and offered pupils a route to better universities by levelling the playing field.




Percentage of pupils reporting that learning Latin has a positive impact on literacy and attainment in other subjects.

Our School Day

- Children can be dropped off at school from 7.45am and do not need to be collected until 5.30pm Monday Thursday and by 4pm on a Friday.
- Our school fee includes both the formal school day <u>and</u> the After School Enrichment Programme.
- Within the After School Enrichment Programme, homework support is provided by teachers to ensure homework is not just completed but properly understood by each child.
- Subject clinics are offered as an integral part of our After School Enrichment Programme for children who need additional support in any subject area, either short or long-term.

Our relaxed and comfortable uniform is ordered from Lands' End


Children can choose from our uniform selection:

Footwear: Crocs, flip flops or trainers (trainers must be worn for PE).










Our Feeder School

We have partnered with Island Primary to become their feeder high school. Island Primary children will be offered priority placement in Year 7 of CF School subject to our admissions policy.
